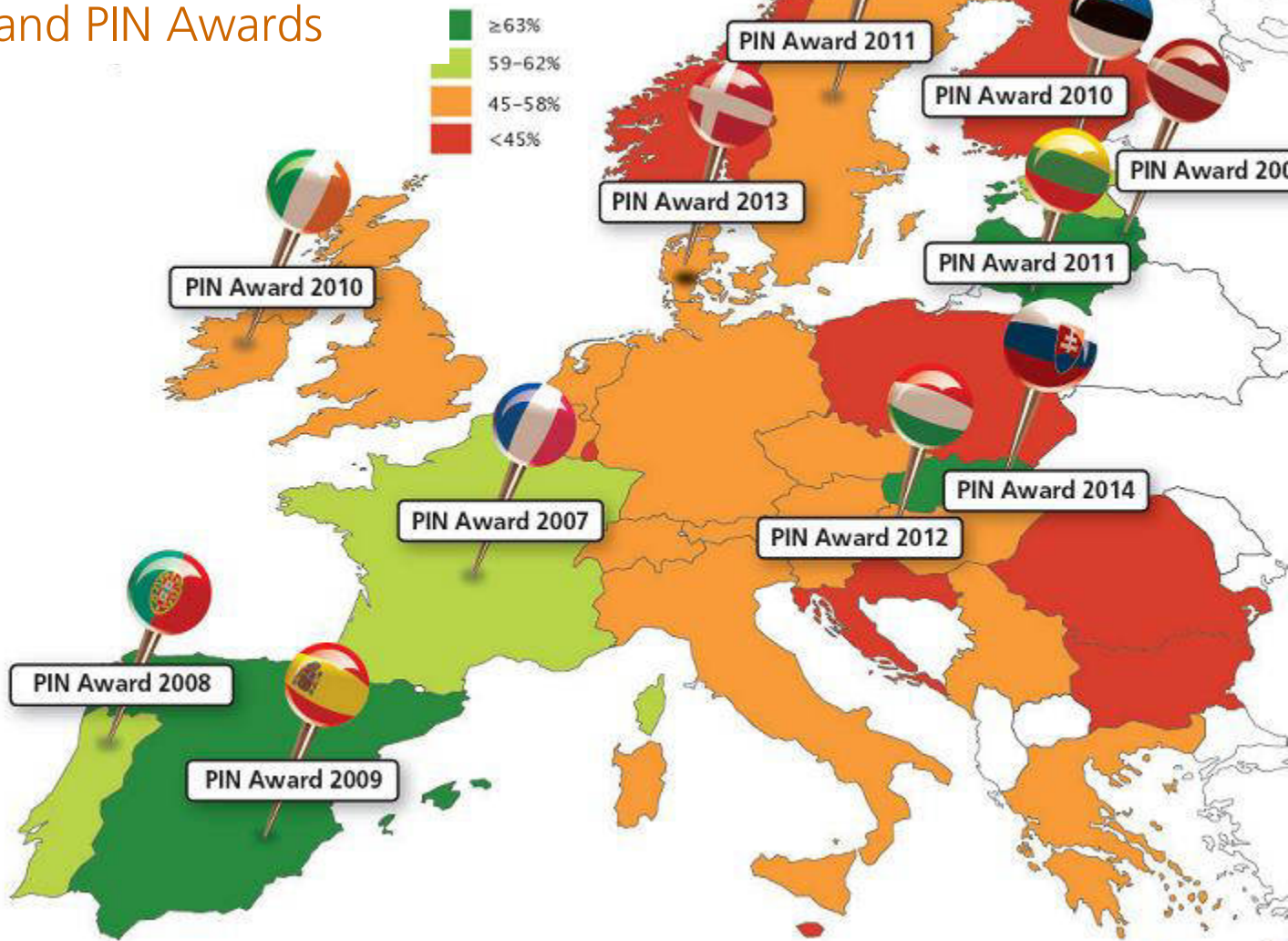

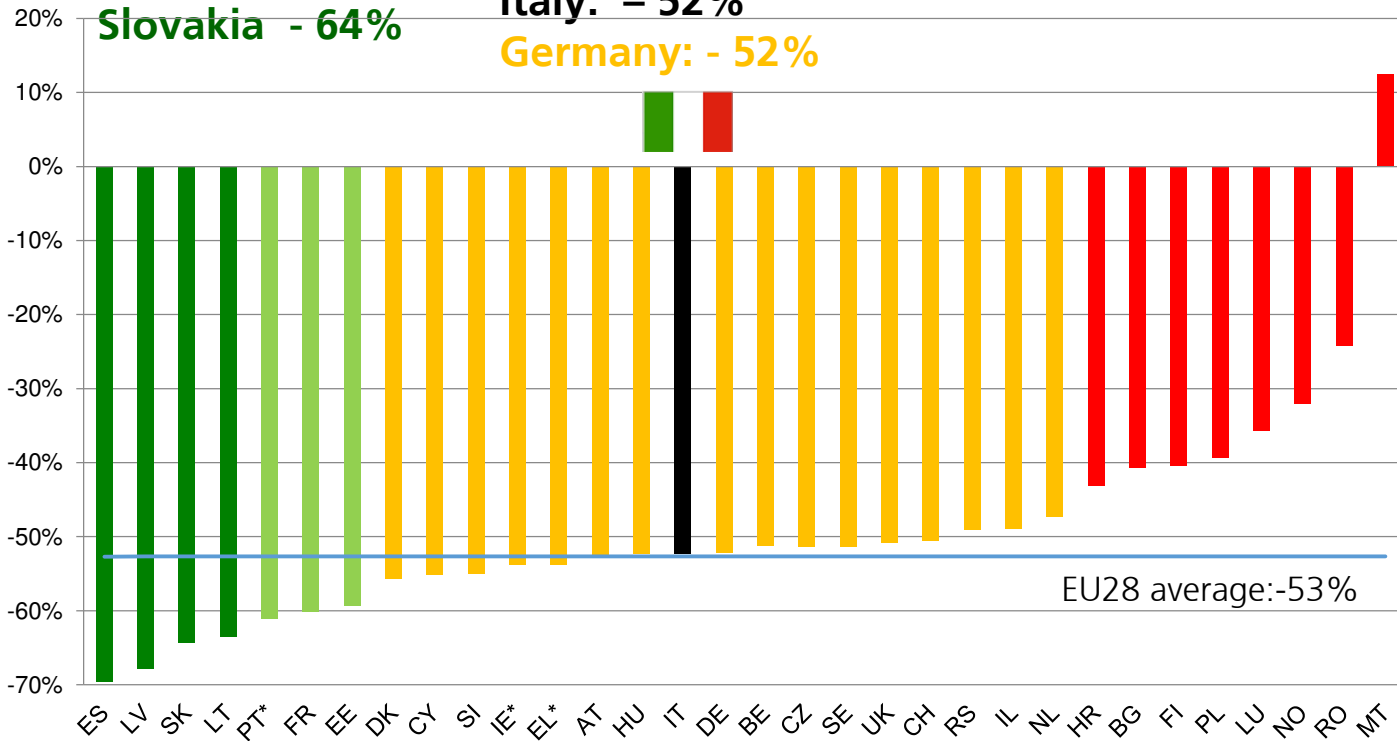

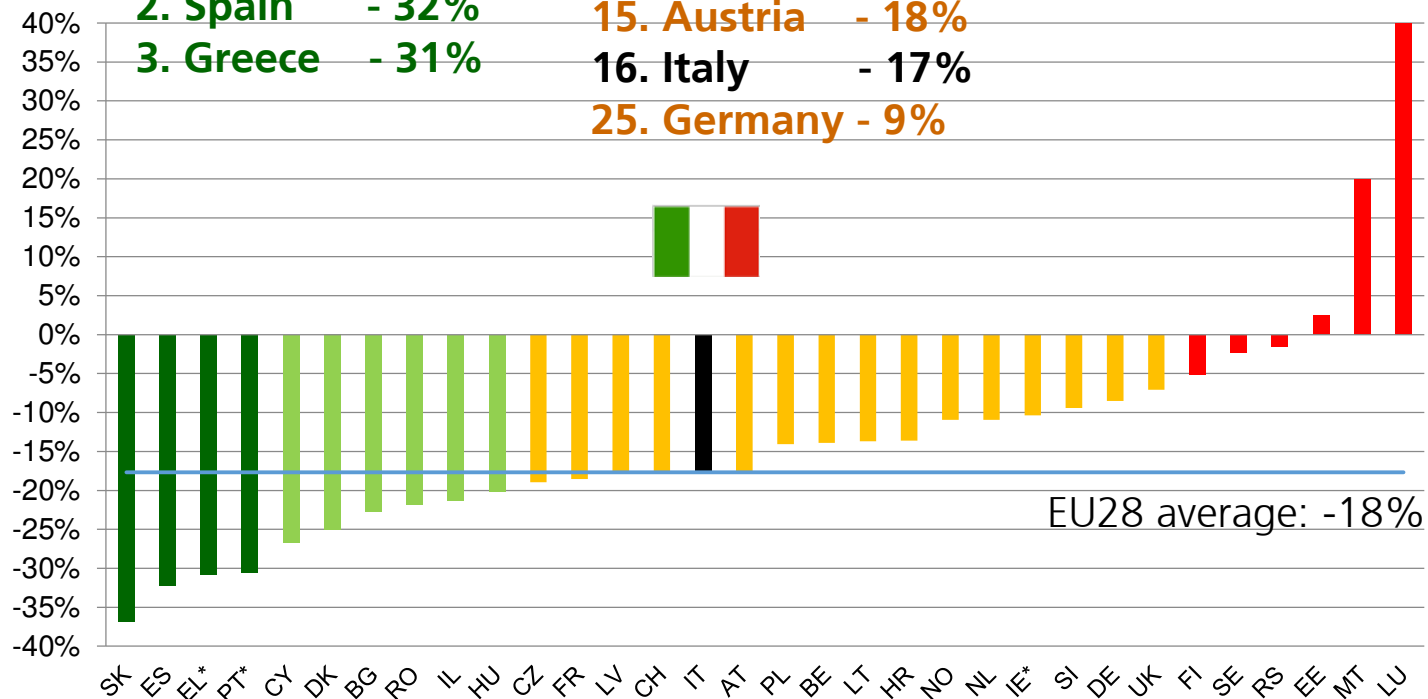

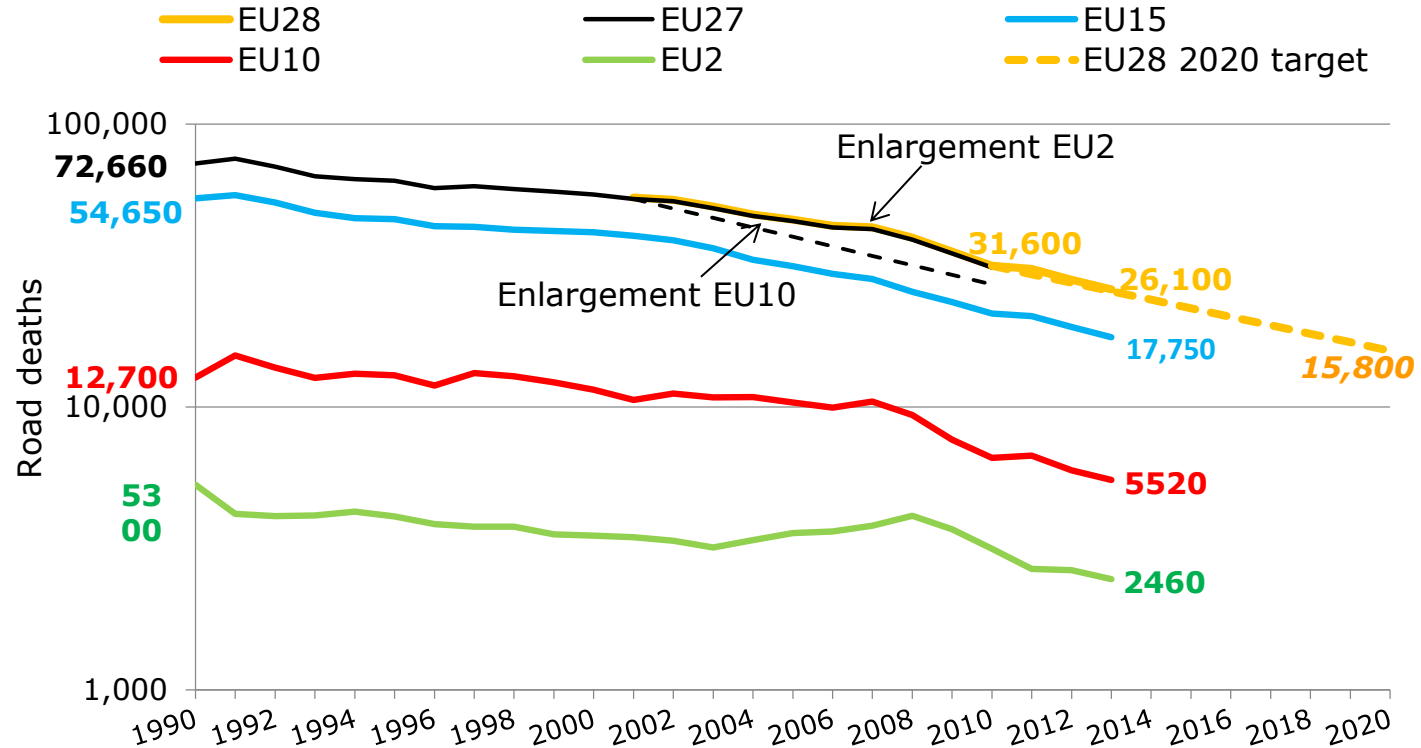

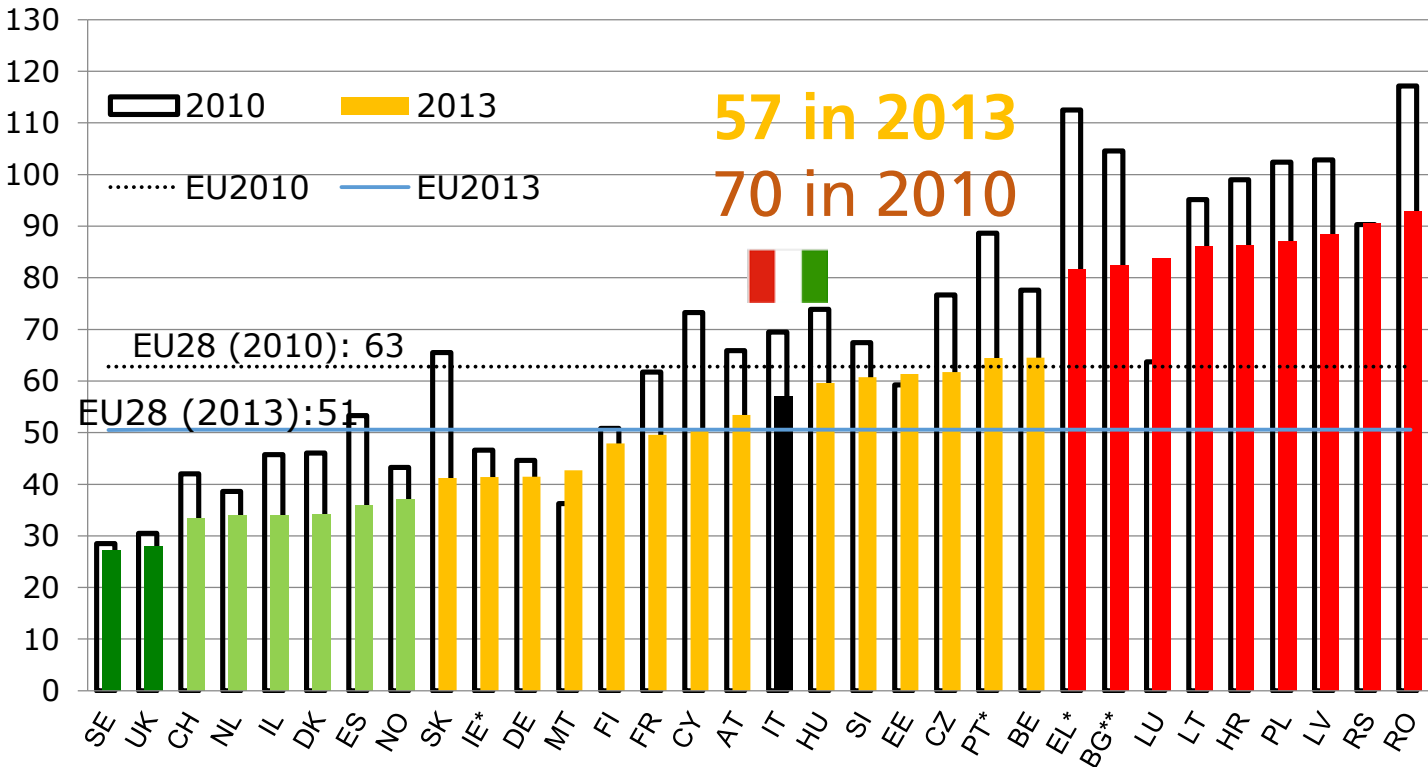

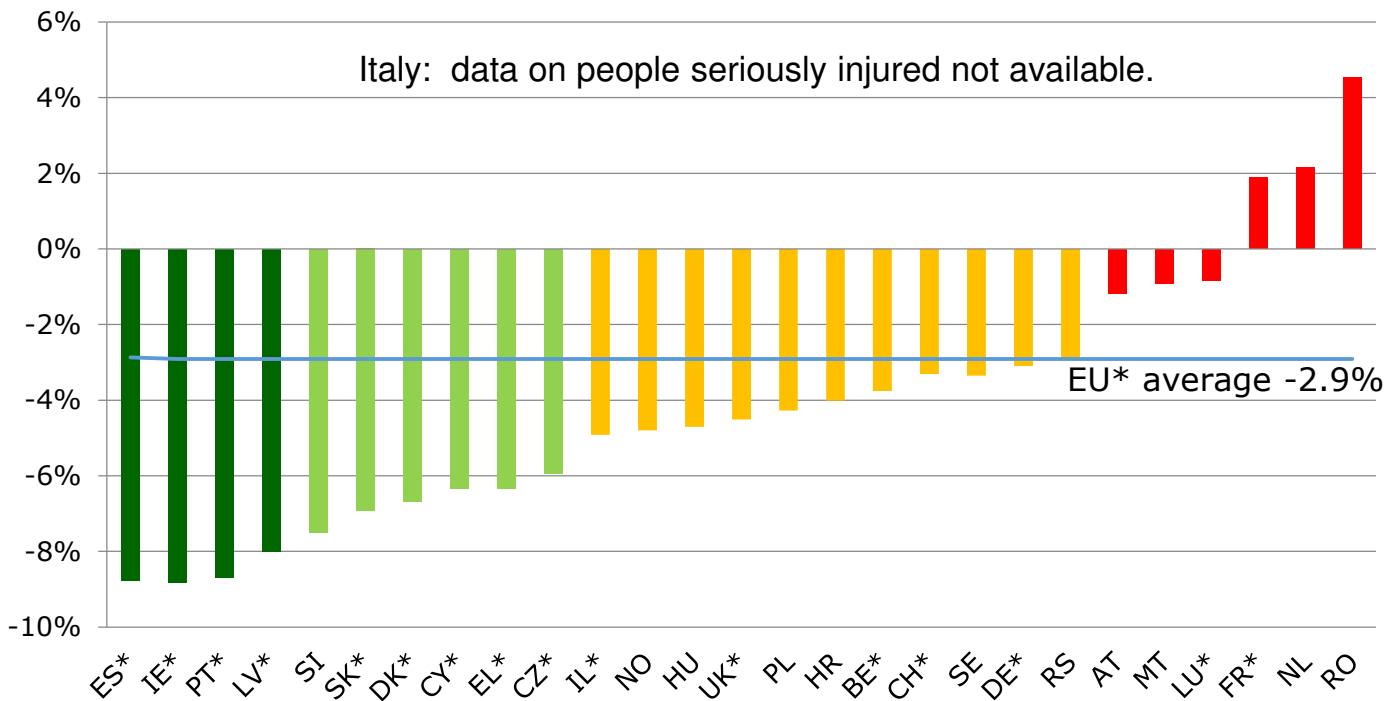
Reduction in road deaths since 1990

ETSC recommendations to the EU

- ✓ Adopt a target of 35% reduction between 2014 and 2020 in the number of people seriously injured (based on MAIS3+).
- ✓ Adopt a fully fledged strategy to tackle serious injuries including measures against which delivery can be made accountable.

ETSC recommendations to the EU

- ✓ Within the context of the revision of the General Safety Regulation prioritise the introduction of in-vehicle safety technologies linked to the risk factors:
 - Intelligent Speed Assistance
 - Seat belt reminders on all seats
 - Alcohol interlocks

ETSC recommendations to Member States

- ✓ **Enforcement:** Intensify enforcement of the key risks including drink driving, speeding and seat belts and child restraints by setting targets for minimum level of checks of the motorist population, e.g. 1 in 5 motorists should be checked each year.
- ✓ Extend the four instruments of the **Infrastructure Safety Directive** to all roads.
